

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Brief about the Program (Activity/Event)	On day one, Ms. Deepa gave a brief introduction of classical, folk dances and Natyashastra. She also touched upon the Gandabandhan parampara, Abhinay Darpan book, types of Abhinyas, concept of Ardhanarinateshwar etc. With demonstration, she elaborated on various Mudras - Ang-pratyanga - Upanga that included hasta mudras, neck, head and eye gestures and how they can inspire a designer to create three dimensional forms. She talked of Tandav-Lasya that is masculine and feminine balance and its application in any art form. The day was concluded with an interesting session on Rasa-Nishpatti demonstrating nine types of emotions and their relevance in design and space creation. Day two initiated with talk on classical dances of India like Kathak, Bharatnatyam, Manipuri, Mohiniatam, Satriya, Gothipuri, Kathakali, Chahu etc. and their aspects like Granth tradition, deties, costume, significance etc. Principles of basic design such as rhythm, balance, harmony, flow etc. were discussed with respect to kathak dance through demos. Students actively participated in the course and utilized remaining two days for assignments completion under monitoring of core faculty. Overall they gained a new perspective on how classical dance art form is closely related to design and can be taken as an inspiration to design innovative forms and meaningful spaces in architecture.


03 Comfort

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Brief about the (Activity/Event)	The tensile workshop was integrated in the second year architectural design studio. For the design project, students were expected to apply the knowledge and material explored in the tensile workshop. On Day 1, Gatkal sir introduced the concept tensile structural systems through simple experiments involving students. Students were asked to bring few basic materials like tensile cloth, pins, base board to do experiments after introductory session by Gatkal sir. A lot for exploratory models were developed by students which continued as homework and students came up with innovative options for tensile structure on Day 2. 

Brief about the Program (Activity/Event)	Hon. Commissioner of police approached the institute to work with students to solve the traffic problems at various junctions in Nashik. The project was taken under two subjects namely Research In Architecture and URBAN STUDIES with 4th Yr. B-Arch students. Students were distributed in groups to cover approximately 82 major junctions across city. Students did and extensive survey of the junctions to identify issues. This was done methodically using the Survey Templates prepared in the studio. Survey Research was accompanied by representatives of traffic police. Collected Data was then processed to analyse and arrive at Design Solutions to resolve the issues / improve the conditions. The presentation was given at Commissioner's Office and was taken ahead for implementation. For more critical junctions, students improvised the proposed solutions as per the discussion, inputs, & suggestions from RTO & Police Officials; and monitored the same on-site. 

Jayesh imparting basic knowledge about the properties and potential of the material. During two days students were also trained to treat bamboo for construction purpose and utilise the same for different joineries. The outcome was a Geodesic Dome. The modules required for the dome were to be made using bamboo sections joined by steel plates. The various tasks of cutting the bamboo to appropriate lengths with precision, cutting steel plates, drilling holes in the plates and nut bolting them together was allocated to different groups of students. Finally after the preparation was done, the assembly of the geodesic dome was completed.
Outcome	The process of part to whole was a valuable learning for the students and in coherence with the institute philosophy 'Learning by doing' and Co-existence with Nature'. All of them were inspired by the innumerable possibilities that this wonder grass had to offer, that too with the minimum environmental impact.





Brief about the Program (Activity/Event)	Certificate course on Parametric explorations with bamboo was conducted in consolidated manner for consecutive 4 days. The course kick-started with a presentation by Akshay and his team showing various types of bamboos, the treatment given to them to increase their life and various projects carried out by them. During first two days they designed a parametric façade for the college building along with a hyperbolic pavilion. The parametric façade consisted of 36 modules made from bamboo frames. The frames were joined together by strips of sliced bamboo of various lengths that gave it a dynamic and parametric form. During next two days, the students used the techniques learnt for a small 4' x 4' module on a larger scale to make a hyperbolic pavilion of 20' X 20'. The pavilion consisted of 8 triangular frames which were joined together by nut-bolt system and supported by bamboo props initially. As the strips of sliced bamboo were fitted, the props could be removed.
Outcome	Students were introduced to bamboo as construction material and various possibilities and potential of Bamboo as a modern material. Parametric façade making with bamboo reflected modern architectural innovation possible with Bamboo which is generally looked upon as a vernacular material. During the process, students got hands on experience of working with bamboo and various cutting, joinery techniques used while working.



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



Brief about the Program (Activity/Event) Every year workshop topics are identified to value add the course curriculum under various subjects. Efforts are taken to call the experts from the field to conduct the workshop. Activities based on the workshop learnings such as assignments, analytical studies, field visits, surveys etc. those are needed to achieve the workshop outcomes, are undertaken during lectures allotted for institute philosophy for the respective year which are over and above the stipulated time for the respective subject conduct. The workshop on streets for people was conducted by 'Institute for Transportation and Development Policy (ITDP), India' for fourth year B. Arch students, subject of Research in Architecture, under the Institute Philosophy – "Learning by Doing". The workshop was conducted in composite manner with partial conduction by expert and partial conduction at institute level under the guidance of core faculty. It is a step towards the betterment of Indian Urban streets by designing them to encourage non-motorized and public transport by meticulously analyzing the patterns of street usage by people in response to factors like availability of footpaths, shading on streets, lighting provisions, vehicle speed, amenities, safety, user friendliness and many more. Students surveyed the identified main streets within the Nashik city and mapped the observations. After analyzing the same, street design proposals were generated under five parameters of walkability, parking, footpaths, crowd streets mapping and building use. ITDP being an advisory body for the local authorities, the proposals thus generated are aimed to be presented to the Municipal Corporation. Nashik in the form of street design guidelines for further development and execution. The work was also exhibited at various locations for public by Lokmat Nashik First.



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Brief about the Program (Activity/Event)	A 2 day workshop on Climate Responsive Architecture was conducted by prof. Kolhatkar. On the first day of this workshop, Prof. Kolhatkar explained in detail various scientific tools and techniques such as sundial, sun path diagram, wind rose, psychrometric chart, bio climatic chart etc. useful in assessing climatic parameters like sun, wind, radiation, humidity, sky condition etc. for a particular site. Chandori is a small village about 25 kms East of Nashik in the Niphad Taluka, Maharashtra, It is located on the banks of river Godavari. This is the place where River Godavari makes a moon crescent like shape and hence the village is named Chandori (चंद्रकोर).

Parts of the Godavari river passing through Chandori village had dried up in the summer of 2016 because of the ongoing drought in regions of Maharashtra. Several temples had resurfaced from the river bed for the first time in over three decades. The last time the villagers had seen some of these temples was way back in 1982, when Nashik had witnessed a drought of this scale.

The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) has no record of these ancient temples and the only mention of these structures and the ghots along the Godavari could be found in the Nashik Gazetteer dating back to the British era.

Brief about the Program (Activity/Event)

These shrines used to be a part of the ghats constructed by Sardar Hingne and Vinchurkar, the ministers of the Peshwas, who were in-charge of Chandori. The Nashik Gazetteer states that the ghats and the temples were submerged after the Nandur Madhyameshwar dam was built in 1907. The villagers claimed that the temples were built in the 17th century and went under water after the Godavari changed its course.

As the temples will not resurface unless a drought of the same magnitude hits the area a need was felt to document this part of history which would otherwise be lost to the future generations. The second year B Arch students studied and documented the temples as a part of their academic curriculum. An exercise was set where they had to design an interpretation centre for the village of Chandori. This Interpretation centre would be on the banks of the river Godavari from where the visible tops of the temples bear a silent testimony to the art of a bygone era.

Second year students could document well, however, for software skill set we had to rely on 4th year students to produce quality drawings




